OKC Grazing Conference to Feature Allan Savory

The *Grazing Lands Dollar\$ and Cent\$* conference on August 5 and 6 in Oklahoma City will feature internationally-recognized grazing expert Allan Savory. Savory is the author of *Holistic Management: A New Framework for Decision-Making* (see sidebar) and co-founder of the Savory Center in Albuquerque.

The Oklahoma Grazing Lands Conservation Association, a consortium of farm, government and conservation groups, is sponsor. The conference will be held at Langston University/OKC, 4605 N. Lincoln Blvd.

Friday morning will feature a panel discussion on the health of Oklahoma grazing lands from

the producer's perspective and a session with Charlie Orchard titled "Land EKG: Optimizing Profit by Enhancing Rangeland Health."

In the afternoon Savory will teach participants how to use livestock to reverse land degradation. He will also lead an evening session titled "Creating a Sustainable Civilization through Holistic Decision Making."

Saturday, participants will travel to the ARS Grazing Lands Research Station in El Reno. Savory and Orchard will lead breakout sessions while there. The day will end with a visit to Ft. Reno Historic Cemetery.
