

Oklahoma Farm Statistics and Agricultural Research Funding Overview

A Decade of Agricultural Research Funding at OSU

The information in this publication was compiled into summary form to inform the public on research funding for agricultural commodities in Oklahoma. The publication includes a broad picture of Oklahoma's main commodities including: 1) cattle, 2) poultry, 3) hogs, 4) wheat, 5) corn, 6) peanuts, 7) cotton, and 8) soybeans.

Information contained in the report spans a ten-year period unless otherwise indicated. General statistical information was obtained from the U.S.D.A. National Agricultural Statistics Service when available. However, in sections where more information was needed, other data sources were used. For example, the poultry section uses figures from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Poultry Registration Database. This Database offered current and specific information

making it possible to categorize broilers by county and type of production arrangement.

The report also includes research funding information from the following Departments at Oklahoma State University: 1) OSU Agricultural Grants and Contracts Office, 2) Animal Science, 3) Plant and Soil Sciences, 4) Bio-systems and Agricultural Engineering, 5) Agricultural Economics, and 6) the College of Veterinary Medicine. Agricultural research dollars reported in funding graphs for each commodity were converted through the Consumer Price Index to allow for inflationary increases over a decade time period. The Consumer Price Index base factor for 1999 was used in calculating the funding amounts.

Number of Total Farms in OK 1989-1999

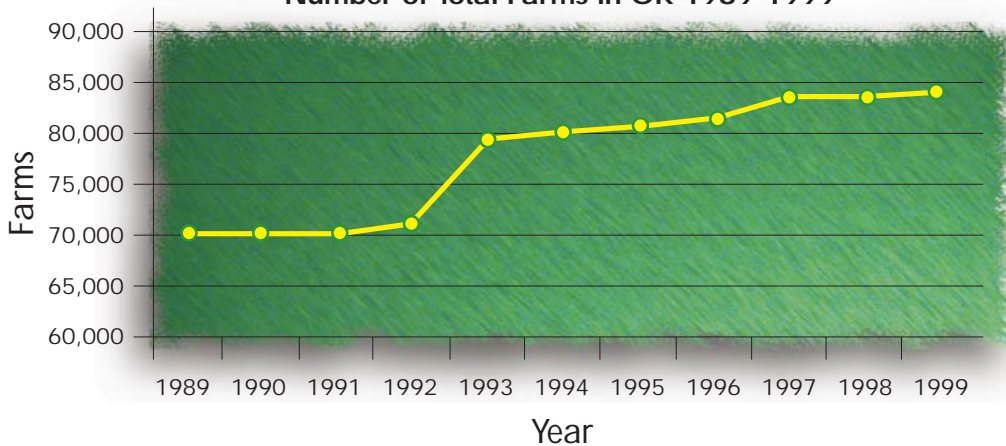

Average Net Farm Income per Farm 1989-1999

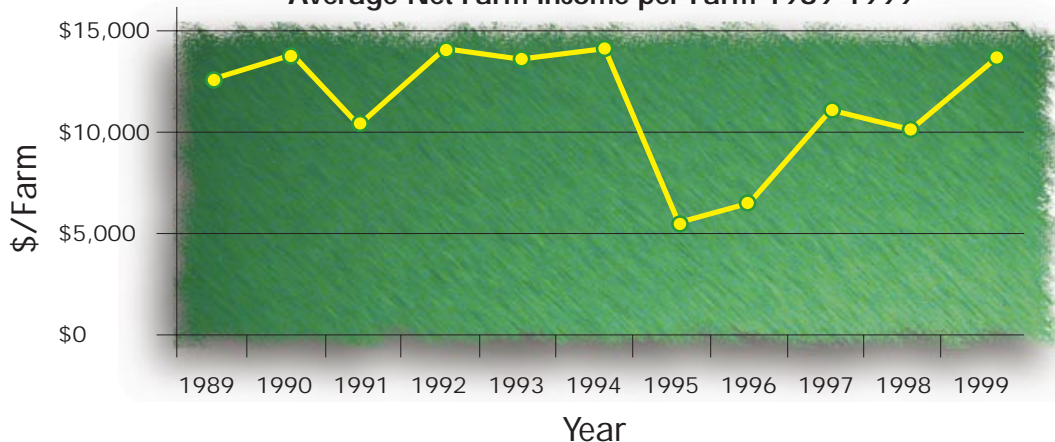

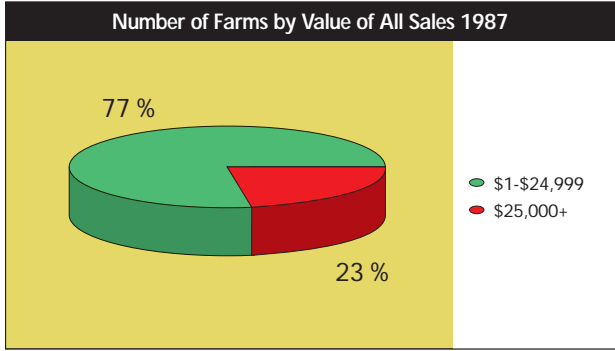

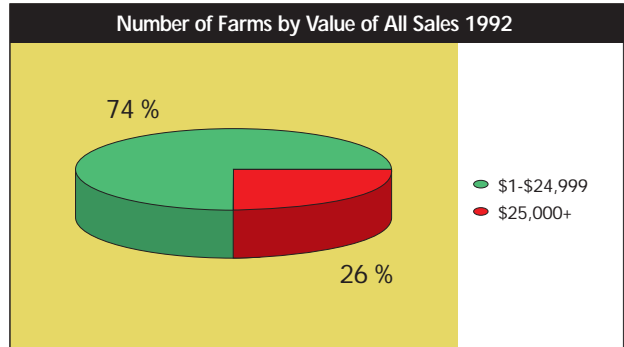

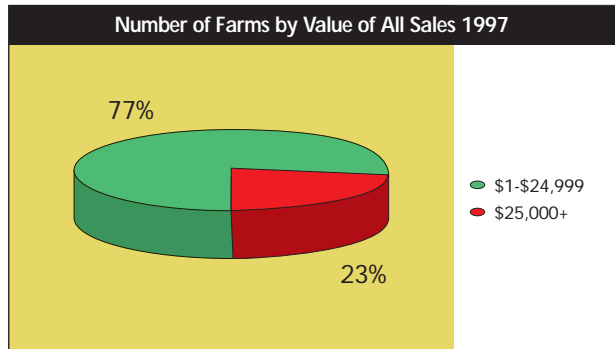

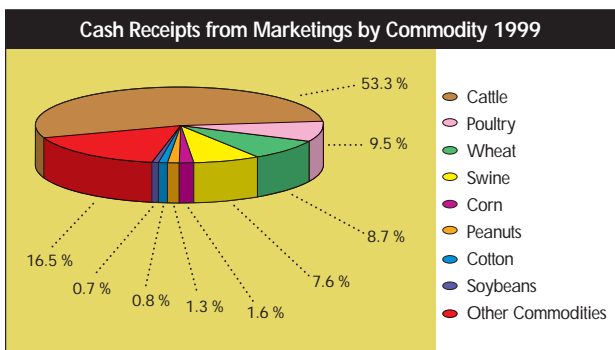

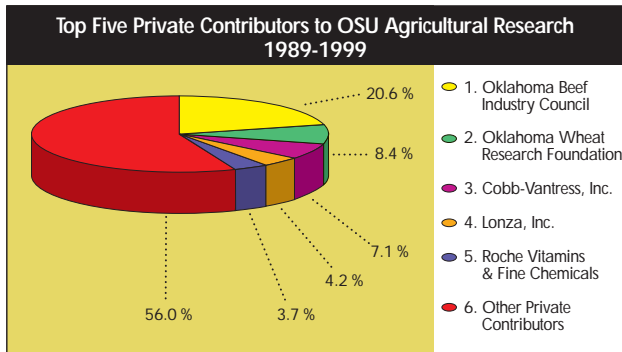

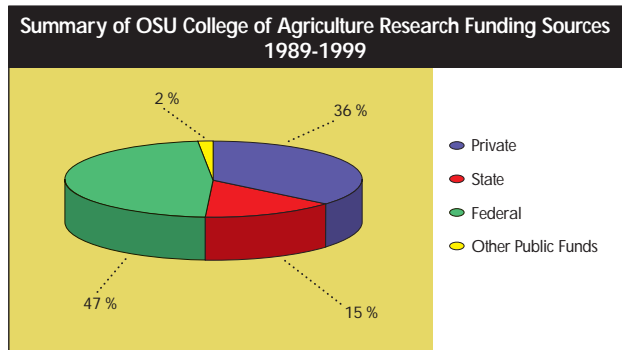

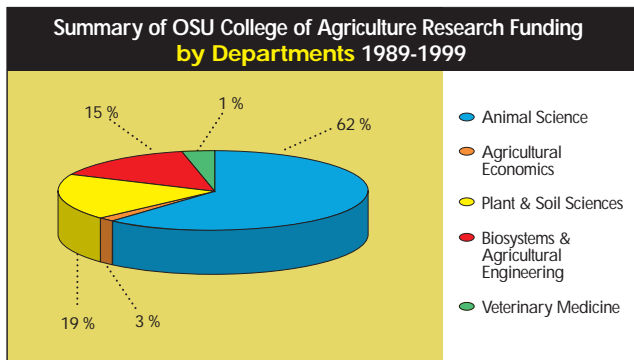
